Award Information

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants must be:

- actively employed by a stock feed milling company, which is a Full or Provisional Member of SFMCA.
- over the age of 18
- available to attend the training, Australasian Milling Conference and tour

Those employed within government departments or any other service or supply business to the stock feed industry are not eligible to apply for this Award.

Key Dates

Midnight 13 February 2022 Applications close 14 to 15 May 2022 Awardee training

15 to 17 May 2022 Australasian Milling Conference

17 to 22 May 2022 Southeast Queensland feed industry tour

Applications

Applications are open to employees working in any area of the feed industry including production, technical services, sales, administration and purchasing. All entries must be made by completing the entry form found at the end of this booklet. Such entries must be received in electronic format at the nominated email address by 3 February 2020. The winning entrants will receive their awards at the Australasian Milling Conference being held at the Gold Coast Convention & Exhibition Centre, 15-17 May 2022.

Applicants must have their application approved by suitably authorised senior management within their business. There applicant must be over 18. As a Development Award, there will be preference given to applicants who have the greatest capacity to gain benefit from winning the award for themselves, their employer and more widely the stock feed industry.

Entrants are requested to complete the application form at the back of this booklet.

The Award

There will be **5 State Development Award winners** with one from each of the SFMCA Branches (being Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria/Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia.

The winners will receive:

- Industry recognition through presentation of their award at the 2022 Australasian Milling Conference.
- Training on leading people, leading change and customer engagement prior to the conference 14-15 May 2022
- Travel, accommodation and registration to attend the 2022 Australasian Milling Conference 15 17 May 2022
- Study Tour of the Queensland stockfeed industry 18 to 22 May 2022 (subject to COVID restrictions).
- Opportunity to gain knowledge and experience from interacting with other State Development Award winners.

The Study Tour will include guided visits as a group to a number of feed mills, premix plants, raw material suppliers, grain handling facilities, livestock producers and end user processors.

This Award does not include any allowance for wages or salary whilst the applicant is away from their normal course of duties at the 2022 Australasian Milling Conference or study tour. Applicants need to ensure they are available for the period 13 to 23 May 2022 to take part in the Australasian Milling Conference and the award tour.

Following the conference and tour, the successful applicant from each State will be required to attend a Branch meeting and provide a presentation relating to the study tour findings.

Judges

The Selection Committee (judges) for the Award will comprise the Executive Committee of each Branch. Each Branch will select their State Development Award winner. The convenor of each State Selection Committee shall be the Chairperson of each Branch Executive Committee. The judges' decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into. Selection may include an interview with some of the applicants.
